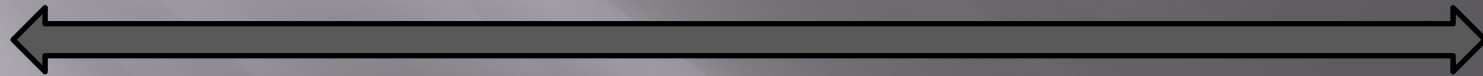

The “RAIN” Acronym

Respond

Do Something, Don't Freeze Up

Assess

Suspect, Victims, & Location

Isolate

Yourself & Others

Notify

Proper Authorities

Respond

Do something, Don't freeze up



1. Look around
2. Find out what is happening
3. Identify the source of the disturbance

Assess

Suspect, Victims, & Locations

Status of the Suspect

Description, weapons, actions, location, emotional state, known history

Status of Victims

How many, injuries, other potential victims

Note your Location

Inside/outside, will door lock, how will help need to get to you

Isolate

Yourself & Others



**Separate yourself and
others you're
responsible for**



**Evacuate,
Shelter In Place,
or Lockdown**



**Discuss, Practice
&
Prepare**



Notify

Proper Authorities



Assign someone to call police
911, text message, e-mail, panic button, Radio



Police may be responding to
